? What is Plastic Pyrolysis? Why am I hearing about it now?

Plastic pyrolysis is an industrial process where plastic waste is heated to create oil. Companies call it "advanced recycling" but the EPA does not classify plastic pyrolysis as a form of "recycling." Instead, it treats it as waste combustion or waste-to-energy process under federal law.

Resynergi seeks approval to operate California's only plastic incinerator using the pyrolysis process in our Rohnert Park neighborhood. The process is expected to produce extremely hazardous pollutants like dioxins (same class of chemicals in Agent Orange), lead, mercury, cadmium, arsenic, PFAS, and VOCs.



Why We Don't Want It in Rohnert Park (SOMO Village)

- Health Risks: Polluted air and water will affect our health (families, kids, seniors)
- Safety Concerns: Similar facilities across the country have had fires and explosions.
- False Recycling: It's not true recycling—just more pollution dressed up as "green."

The company has given their vision full of marketing fluff but **their technology is unproven**. They share that they have no source of testing information to confirm it's safe.
